



IN THE MATTER OF FIXING OF DATE FOR PUBLIC HEARING #2 FOR CDBG/HOME/OHTF CHIP PROGRAM FUNDING

Mr. Rhoades moved to approve the following "Notice of Public Hearing"; seconded by Mrs. Delaplaine and all voted YEA.

The Darke County Board of Commissioners, on behalf of Darke County and the City of Greenville through a CHIP Program Partnership Agreement, intends to apply to the Ohio Development Services Agency, Office of Community Development for funding under the Program Year 2016 Community Housing Impact and Preservation (CHIP) Program providing Darke County and the City of Greenville meet applicable program requirements. The CHIP Program is comprised of federal Small Cities Community Development Block Grant funds, federal HOME Investment Partnership Program funds, and Ohio Housing Trust Fund (OHTF) Program funds.

On Wednesday, February 10, 2016, the Darke County Board of Commissioners conducted its first public hearing to inform citizens about the County's proposed CHIP Program. The first public hearing included an explanation of eligible activities and other important program requirements.

Based on citizen input and a recommendation of the County's Housing Advisory Committee respecting the assessment of Darke County's and the City of Greenville's housing needs, the Darke County Board of Commissioners is proposing to carry out the following activities under the Darke County-City of Greenville CHIP Partnership Program:

IN THE MATTER OF SCHEDULED IMPROVEMENTS TO DARKE COUNTY ROADS AND BRIDGES FOR 2016

An estimated \$3,630,634 worth of improvements to Darke County roads and bridges is scheduled for 2016. This is \$872,685 more than was planned for 2015, and is mostly due to anticipated federal funds earmarked for guardrail, signs, and the Center Street bridge. Our local funds come strictly from gas tax and license fees returned monthly to Darke County by the State of Ohio for local highway operations. No real estate taxes, sales taxes, or County General Fund money is provided for any of this work.

The responsibilities of 30 employees are 521 miles of County road and 531 bridges on County and Township roads.

COUNTY ROAD SURFACING: Seven sections of County roads (17.91 miles) are scheduled for new asphalt (hot mix) surfaces from May – July.

Total estimated cost for 48.81 miles: \$1,812,234 (all local cost)

PAVEMENT MARKING: About 219 miles of road will have new centerline and no-passing markings applied, and about 302 lane-miles (151 road miles) will have white edge-line markings applied at a total estimated cost of \$ 155,500 (all locally funded).

TOWNSHIP AID: An estimated \$25,000 worth of labor and equipment will be furnished to Township Trustees for work on their roads such as culvert and subsurface tile replacements, tree and brush removal, drainage, and road repairs.

CRACK SEALING: An estimated 30-35 miles of County Road will have pavement cracks sealed with hot-applied crack sealant material by County personnel. This will require an estimated \$70,000 of materials, and will be performed throughout the year.

SIGNS: A federal grant was secured late last year for \$22,000, and with local funds will furnish a total of \$27,500 for new signs and posts to upgrade warning signs, road name signs, and unincorporated village signs on Darke County roads. The County will furnish \$5,500 of the sign costs and supply all labor and equipment for the project.

SCHEDULED IMPROVEMENTS (CONT.)

GUARDRAIL RECONSTRUCTION: A major project will begin March 28th to replace guardrails on six County roads in five different Townships. A total of **10,800 feet** of guardrail will be removed and installed on **Greenville-St. Marys, Medford, Hollansburg-Sampson, Staudt, Hollansburg-Richmond, and County Home** Roads. The project is federally funded through an application first filed in **2011**. A contract has been awarded to PDK Construction of Pomeroy, Ohio for an estimated total project cost of **\$200,699**. The new guardrail will meet all current standards and replace aging, substandard railing.

Total Estimated County Road Repair and Improvement Costs: **\$2,290,933**
 Total estimated local cost: **\$2,068,933 (90%)**

BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION AND REHABILITATION

Six new bridges are scheduled to be built under force account by the County bridge crews and **six additional bridges** will be rehabilitated during the year. Also, the replacement of the **Center Street Bridge** in the Village of Versailles is scheduled for contract sale on June 16th with construction anticipated during July-September. Like all other bridges, this project was designed by the County Engineer's Office. Unlike the twelve projects, **80%** of the estimated construction and inspection costs (**\$656,000**) will be paid by federal bridge replacement funds, applied for in **2011**. The local portion will be shared by the County Engineer and the Village. Of the **thirteen projects** for this year, **eight** are on County Roads, **four** are on Township Roads, and **one** is on a Versailles Village Street.



(By Ohio law, force account bridge estimates must include the cost of all County labor, fringe benefits, materials and equipment, and additional mandatory overhead rates on labor and materials. The labor and overhead rates are not included in "Actual County Cost" since one is a fixed cost and the other is fictitious. Also, the structural steel for four new bridges was purchased and paid for in 2015. These amounts are also not included.)

In total, an estimated value of **\$3,630,634** in road, bridge, and sign improvements will be made in 2016 to County roads, and to bridges on County and Township Roads in Darke County with an estimated County local expenditure of **\$ 2,491,300**.

IN THE MATTER OF LEASE EXTENSION AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE BOARD OF DARKE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND GOODWILL EASTER SEALS MIAMI VALLEY

Mrs. Delaplane moved to approve the signing of the five (5) yr. Lease, w/option to continue for five (5) more years; motion was seconded by Mr. Rhoades and all voted YEA.

WHEREAS, the previous Landlord and the Tenants entered into a Lease dated February 21st, 1995, (collectively, the "*Lease*"), for the premises located at 637 Wagner Avenue in the City of Greenville, State of Ohio, as more particularly described in the Lease.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Effective June 1st, 2016 a five (5) year lease extension will be enacted effective through May 31st, 2021 with annual rents due (real estate taxes, insurance and all common area maintenance charges inclusive) in the amount of **Fifty-four Thousand Four Hundred Fifty & 00/100 Dollars (\$54,450.00)** payable in equal monthly installments of **Four Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-Seven & 50/100 Dollars (\$4,537.50)** due on the first day of each calendar month. This rate is equal to an "ALL IN RATE" of **\$3.75/square foot**.

LEASE (CONT.)

- 2. Thereafter, a second five (5) year option will be available to exercise beginning June 1st, 2021 effective through May 31st, 2026 with an annual rental rate not to exceed an "ALL IN RATE" of \$4.00/square foot equal to annual rents due of **Fifty-Eight Thousand Eighty & 00/100 Dollars (\$58,080.00)** payable in equal monthly installments of **Four Thousand Eight Hundred Forty & 00/100 Dollars (\$4,840.00)**. Such terms will be concluded prior to entering the renewable option.
- 3. Commencing in the second five (5) year period, both the Landlord and Tenant reserve the right to terminate the terms of this agreement with no penalty on the other party's behalf by providing written notice to the address on record of intent to terminate twenty-four (24) months in advance.

Except as herein amended and modified, all other terms, conditions, covenants, agreements, and capitalized terms of the Lease are hereby incorporated herein by reference and shall control and govern.

Unless defined herein, all capitalized terms shall have the same meaning as defined in the Lease.

This Lease Extension shall bind and inure to the benefit of the successors and assigns of Landlord and the successors and assigns of Tenant.

WHEREAS, displaying a pinwheel or planting a pinwheel garden in April will serve as a positive reminder that together, we can prevent child abuse and keep children safe;






